This year, I wish to share my thoughts on subjects that may not have a direct bearing on GiftAbleD or the disability sector, but which we must address. In recent years, I have observed two major impediments preventing our nation from reaching the highest Human Development Index (HDI) standards.

The first is the enduring shadow of caste practices in India. This is arguably the longest-running, and one of the most dehumanizing, forms of discrimination in human history. A society fundamentally built on systemic injustice cannot forge a truly glorious future. We must cease living in an imaginary past of fabricated equality and prosperity. We need to acknowledge the profound historical blunders of over two millennia. The practice of caste must be utterly rejected from our lives.

The second impediment is pervasive corruption and a deficit of integrity. This is not confined to public life; it permeates the majority of our citizenry. A nation's character fundamentally defines its trajectory and potential for growth. Yet, superficial bragging and self-praise have become the norm. Strengths are exaggerated while fundamental weaknesses are glossed over. We cannot possibly raise the national standard without first being rigorously honest with ourselves and with each other.

It is in addressing these foundational challenges that GiftAbleD can serve as a leading light, helping to build a fair, honest, and merit-driven environment where every citizen can reach their fullest potential.

# A Decade of Creating Ripple effect

<b>2013-2016</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Between 2013 and 2016, a series of focused initiatives were implemented to advance inclusion and accessibility for persons with disabilities.</li><li>• In 2013, awareness programs encouraged communities to learn sign language, fostering an inclusive environment for individuals with hearing impairments.</li><li>• The following year, the Deaf and Vision Club was established to nurture leadership, teamwork, and confidence through inclusive activities such as ArtAble and archery for the visually impaired.</li><li>• In 2015, communication barriers faced by women with disabilities in healthcare were addressed through the development of tactile models and guiding videos. Continuing this effort, 2016 saw the introduction of ten tactile libraries equipped with tactile books—enabling visually impaired learners to better comprehend complex concepts and promoting equal access to knowledge.</li></ul>
<b>2017-2020</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Between 2017 and 2020, GiftAble advanced disability inclusion through comprehensive skill development programs, inclusive hiring initiatives, and specialized support for small businesses operated by individuals with disabilities.</li><li>• Through widespread accessibility campaigns and sensitivity workshops, as well as the distribution of assistive devices, GiftAble enabled greater participation and independence for persons with disabilities.</li><li>• During this period, the organization also mobilized a network of volunteers and regularly hosted community engagement events aimed at raising awareness and strengthening collaboration with corporates, NGOs, and government bodies.</li><li>• A key focus throughout these years was advocacy for disability rights, with campaigns designed to promote accessibility and inclusion while actively engaging policymakers to drive systemic and legislative change.</li></ul>

## 2021-2024

- Between 2021 and 2024, GiftAbleD significantly expanded its reach and impact by establishing Early Intervention Centers in aspirational districts and setting up independent training centers across multiple states. These centers serve as inclusive development hubs, providing both direct training and financial inclusion support to Persons with Disabilities (PwDs), particularly in underserved and rural communities.
- In addition, a comprehensive livelihood and upskilling initiative was launched, emphasizing sustainable and eco-friendly product development. This program empowered Individuals with Disabilities to build economic independence while fostering environmental stewardship. Through strategic partnerships with corporates, government departments, and educational institutions, these programs have enabled participants to access job-ready skills and employment pathways.
- GiftAbleD's recent collaboration with Salesforce under the Project LearnAbleD initiative marks a milestone in this journey. The program delivers accessible hybrid training in both technical and soft skills—ranging from AI and robotics to employability foundations—ensuring PwDs are prepared for the future workforce. This integrated approach advances multiple Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including Quality Education, Decent Work, Reduced Inequalities, and Partnerships for the Goals, reaffirming GiftAbleD's long-term commitment to inclusion, empowerment, and equitable growth.



### LearnAble


Focuses on providing job-ready courses for graduates with disabilities, enabling them to secure sustainable employment.


## LIVES IMPACTED


## VOLUNTEERS ENGAGED

# SCULPT – INCLUSIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM (IEP)

## OBJECTIVE

The project is committed to delivering holistic educational support to Children with Disabilities (CwDs), fostering an inclusive and enabling learning environment that meets their diverse needs. Its core objectives are two fold: first, to provide individualized educational interventions that enhance learning outcomes and personal development for each child; and second, to strengthen the overall support ecosystem by capacitating teachers and parents through specialized training.

Through these interventions, the initiative not only empowers CwDs to participate meaningfully in mainstream education but also builds the capacity of educators and caregivers to adopt inclusive teaching practices, implement assistive learning tools, and create nurturing learning spaces. This collaborative, twin-track approach—addressing both direct student needs and systemic enablers—ensures lasting inclusion and equitable access to quality education for all.



## PROJECT BACKGROUND

In numerous communities, Children with Disabilities (CwDs) continue to face substantial barriers in accessing quality education. These challenges extend beyond physical constraints to include societal biases, inadequate resources, and limited capacity among teachers and caregivers. This project sought to address these issues comprehensively by concentrating on pre-primary and primary education—critical stages for building foundational learning and holistic development among CwDs.

# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The project was undertaken to advance educational inclusion for Children with Disabilities (CwDs) in pre-primary and primary education. It aimed to strengthen equitable access to quality learning by fostering an inclusive, supportive environment. Through the implementation of targeted interventions, the initiative provided individualized educational support, conducted comprehensive training sessions for teachers and parents, and developed accessible and child-friendly learning materials to enhance participation and learning outcomes.

## Key Achievements:

- Provided Inclusive Education and Early Intervention for 105 Children with Disabilities.
- **Training:** We have successfully trained teachers, parents, and peers on the causes, prevention, and management of disabilities
- Conducted annual Exam and given Report card to Parents.
- Started Remedial Class for School going Children to help them to achieve Educational Goals.
- **Successful Integration:** 16 students with Special needs successfully integrated to mainstream School
- Three students have progressed from low functioning to medium functioning, while one student has advanced from medium functioning to high functioning.
- Educational Visit to Bandit Angulimala Caves, Bannerghatta National Park, Seeta Dwar, Cubbon Park and more
- Increased Parents Involvement in Parents Teachers Meeting.
- Our students participated in District Disability Day events, including sports, dance, and painting, and received prizes.
- Had a Summer Camp May month on Different Themes.

# PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Over the past year, several strategic programs and initiatives were implemented to strengthen the impact and effectiveness of our Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) efforts:

**Individualized Education Plans:** Each student benefits from a customized learning plan that addresses their specific needs and goals.

**Specialized Instruction:** Our instructors have received ongoing professional development to better support students with varying needs.

**Parent and Guardian Involvement:** We have strengthened our communication with parents and guardians to ensure a collaborative approach to each student's education.

**Progress Monitoring:** Regular assessments and feedback mechanisms are in place to track student progress and make necessary adjustments to their learning plans.



## Teacher Training

A comprehensive training program was successfully conducted for educators, focusing on disability awareness and inclusive education. The initiative aimed to build the capacity of teachers by enhancing their understanding, knowledge, and practical skills to effectively support and engage students with disabilities in the classroom.

Throughout the program, a wide range of topics was covered, including the classification of disabilities, differentiated teaching strategies to address diverse learning needs, and the significance of cultivating an inclusive classroom environment. Participants actively engaged in interactive workshops, discussions, and practical exercises designed to reinforce the application of inclusive education principles.



## Awareness Session

We conducted a series of Disability Awareness sessions across four villages, reaching 206 participants. These sessions focused on increasing understanding of the challenges faced by persons with disabilities, promoting inclusivity, and building a more supportive and empathetic community.

The initiative resulted in enhanced community awareness and sensitivity toward disability inclusion. Participants gained a deeper understanding of the value and benefits of the UDID Card, empowering individuals with disabilities to access essential services and entitlements. Furthermore, the sessions strengthened community engagement and collective support, fostering a more inclusive environment for persons with disabilities.



## Peers Group Training In Primary Schools

Peer group training was conducted in four primary schools, covering basic sign language, blindfold activities, color combination exercises, and Brain Gym techniques to promote inclusion and sensory awareness.

A total of 156 participants took part in the sessions. The activities enhanced cognitive development, improved social interaction and communication skills, and expanded access to information. The color-based exercises encouraged creativity, allowing participants to create unique artworks each time.



## Targeted Training for Frontline Workers:

Specialized training programs were conducted for Auxiliary Nurse Midwives (ANMs), Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHAs), and Anganwadi workers. The sessions focused on enhancing their understanding of different types of disabilities, strategies to prevent developmental delays, and methods to identify early warning signs in children. As key community-level frontline workers, they are now better equipped to support families and Children with Disabilities more effectively following this capacity-building initiative.

## Sign Language Sessions

During the year, dedicated Sign Language Sessions were conducted both within the community and at our center. These sessions were designed to enhance communication accessibility for individuals with hearing impairments and to raise awareness among community members about the importance of inclusive communication. Participants were introduced to foundational sign language skills, including common expressions and essential vocabulary, fostering greater understanding, empathy, and inclusion for individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing.



## IDPD 2024



To celebrate the International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD), multiple events were held. On December 3rd, a cultural celebration was organized at Vikas Bhavan, which included singing performances, motivational speeches, and a group dance by Children with Disabilities, showcasing their talents and building confidence. A sports competition was conducted at Saraswathi Susumandir, Balrampur, where our participant Faheem won 3rd place, highlighting the spirit of sportsmanship and inclusion. On December 4th, we had the honor of hosting the State Disability Commissioner at our center. The officer engaged with the children, observed activities, and provided valuable insights and encouragement to the team and families.

# Success Story

Eight year old Kamni lives with her father, Rajesh Kumar, a 36-year-old farmer; her mother, Suman Devi, a 31-year-old homemaker; and her younger brother, Shiva, aged five. She communicates in Awadhi and Hindi and is a bright, expressive child with immense determination.

Drooling has been reduced by 90%</p>

# Academic Success

Despite her initial challenges, Kamni demonstrates a keen interest in every aspect of classroom life. Her engagement in activities and her eagerness to explore new concepts are truly admirable.

In English, Kamni has achieved significant milestones. She confidently identifies all the letters of the alphabet and recognizes seven two-letter words, along with eight family-related words. Her ability to read small-letter words and basic vocabulary is steadily improving. Through playful activities, songs, and storytelling, Kamni continues to build her language skills and eagerly seeks to expand her knowledge.

Mathematics is another area where Kamni is flourishing. She can count from 1 to 50 and, with encouragement, is practicing counting backward from 20 to 1. Kamni shows an understanding of small and big numbers, can identify numerals, and compare their sizes. She is able to solve simple addition problems with some assistance and is making consistent progress in sorting shapes.

Kamni's curiosity shines in Environmental Studies. She enjoys naming different fruits, animals, and birds, and takes a keen interest in national symbols, such as the national anthem and flag colors. Kamni is learning about the importance of basic resources like food and water and is becoming more aware of her surroundings through participatory discussions and activities. Her communication skills have seen great improvement. Kamni now confidently introduces herself and can name her family members, classmates, and teachers. She is becoming more adept at asking questions and expressing her ideas, often using complete sentences. Her ability to tell simple stories is emerging, and she demonstrates increasingly polite language in her interactions.

In dance, Kamni's enthusiasm is palpable. She actively participates in Jumba dance sessions, eagerly imitating moves from routines like "Bam Bam Bhole" and "Choo Choo Aa." Moving confidently to the rhythm, Kamni is becoming more expressive and self-assured through dance. Overall, Kamni's growth across subjects paints a portrait of a dedicated, inquisitive, and creative learner. Her progress is a testament to her resilience and love of learning.

# SVASTYA – EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAM (EIP)

## OBJECTIVE

The program seeks to enhance the overall well-being and health outcomes of Children with Disabilities (CwDs) through personalized therapeutic interventions designed to meet their individual needs. Its objective is to foster a nurturing and supportive environment that promotes growth across physical, emotional, and social dimensions. By integrating therapy into daily routines, the initiative strives to improve quality of life, empower children to overcome developmental challenges, and enable them to achieve their fullest potential.

We remain dedicated to improving the lives of 105 Children with Disabilities (CwDs) through the provision of therapeutic and educational support. Our approach emphasizes holistic development, integrating interventions that enhance learning, promote physical and emotional well-being, and ensure compassionate, comprehensive care for every child.



## Group Therapy and Early Intervention

As part of our ongoing commitment to the holistic development of children in our care, we conducted monthly group therapy sessions throughout the year. These sessions were thoughtfully structured to provide therapeutic support in a nurturing, engaging, and interactive environment, focusing on emotional expression, social interaction, and developmental growth through a combination of structured and play-based activities.

Throughout the year, children enrolled in the program—both center-based and home-based—received regular therapeutic interventions, including:

- Speech Therapy
- Occupational Therapy (OT)
- Physiotherapy (PT)

Each session was tailored to the child's individual needs, focusing on enhancing communication, motor skills, sensory integration, and independence in daily activities.

## Observed Improvements:

As part of our ongoing commitment to the holistic development of children in our care, we conducted monthly group therapy sessions throughout the year. These sessions were thoughtfully structured to provide therapeutic support in a nurturing, engaging, and interactive environment, focusing on emotional expression, social interaction, and developmental growth through a combination of structured and play-based activities.

## Assistive Devices:

To further our commitment to inclusivity, essential assistive devices were provided to children with disabilities based on individual assessments and medical recommendations. These devices aimed to enhance mobility, communication, and independence.

## Key Achievements:

- **Hand Coordination Activities:** Children participated in activities such as threading beads, ball games, drawing, and building blocks. These exercises enhanced motor planning, coordination, fine and gross motor skills, as well as attention span and confidence.
- **Fun and Therapeutic Group Games:** Group games encouraged self-expression, turn-taking, and peer interaction. These activities promoted teamwork, communication, and emotional regulation.
- **Creative Expression:** Art, music, and storytelling activities offered children alternative avenues to express emotions, helping improve mood and reduce anxiety.
- **Inclusive Environment:** Activities were adapted to accommodate varying developmental levels and individual needs, ensuring meaningful participation for every child.

# Success Story

Kareema, a 6-year-old girl diagnosed with Down Syndrome, received continuous therapeutic support aimed at enhancing her motor coordination, speech, communication, and social engagement.



TASKS	IMPROVEMENTS
<b>Mobility and motor coordination</b>	Significant improvements were documented in Kareema's gross motor functioning over the reporting period. She achieved independent sitting without external support and developed the ability to transition smoothly from sitting to standing positions. Most notably, she progressed to unsupported standing for brief periods and initiated supported walking activities. The introduction of wall-supported ambulation marked a crucial milestone in her mobility development. Crawling patterns also emerged during this timeframe.
<b>Limited object manipulation</b>	Fine motor coordination showed measurable advancement. Kareema developed improved grasp patterns and voluntary release mechanisms, though duration limitations persist. Her ability to manipulate objects increased from the initial 2-3 minutes to slightly longer periods, indicating strengthening of hand muscles and improved motor planning.
<b>Communication and Speech Development</b>	Fine motor coordination showed measurable advancement. Kareema developed improved grasp patterns and voluntary release mechanisms, though duration limitations persist. # Project Challenges

CHALLENGES	ADDRESSING CHALLENGES
<b>Limited Accessibility</b>	<b>Collaborative Partnerships:</b> Establishing partnerships with local authorities, community organisations and disability advocacy groups helped address accessibility issues and expand resource groups
<b>Seizure</b>	<b>Children experiencing seizures</b> often face sudden and unpredictable episodes that impact their safety, learning, and everyday activities. Early intervention and specialized care are essential to support their overall well-being.
<b>Toilet Access</b>	Ensuring toilet access in aspirational districts remains a significant challenge – one that demands focused planning, community engagement, and sustainable infrastructure.

# SWATANTRA



Project Swatantra in Uttar Pradesh aims to empower rural Persons with Disabilities and their caregivers by equipping them with relevant, employable skills in collaboration with local producer groups. The program provides region and disability-specific vocational training designed to open up sustainable livelihood opportunities. Its core objective is to enhance the quality of life for Persons with Disabilities and their caregivers by strengthening life skills, raising awareness about disability-related laws, and building marketing and financial literacy.

## OBJECTIVE

The primary objectives of the project were to impart vocational training to 200 youth with disabilities, establish sub-manufacturing units across two Aspirational districts, and facilitate attitudinal and behavioral transformation among the beneficiaries.

Through detailed community surveys and home visits, the project team actively identified and engaged potential candidates with disabilities who could benefit from vocational skill development training. This hands-on approach helped include marginalized individuals who might otherwise have been missed.

## **Pre-assessment to tailor training programs**

Prior to the start of training sessions, every candidate participated in a thorough pre-assessment to evaluate their current skills, abilities, and learning needs. This data-driven process enabled the customization of training programs to address each participant's unique requirements, thereby optimizing their learning outcomes.

The project delivered a rigorous 45-day intensive training program led by experienced trainers skilled in their respective domains. These sessions encompassed a wide range of vocational skills, equipping participants with practical knowledge and hands-on experience vital for future employment.

## **Financial Overview**

The project's budget was strategically managed to ensure the optimal use of resources. Donor contributions played a crucial role in meeting expenses such as training materials, instructor fees, transportation, and administrative costs. Emphasis was placed on financial sustainability to support the project's long-term impact and scalability.

## **Assessment of learning outcomes and engagement in the production unit**

After the completion of training sessions, comprehensive evaluations were carried out to assess participants' learning outcomes and proficiency in newly acquired skills. Selected candidates were then integrated into the production unit, where they applied their training in real-world scenarios. This hands-on experience reinforced their learning and offered valuable exposure to industry standards and practices.

## **Support in other placement**

In addition to providing employment opportunities within the production unit, the project extended comprehensive support to participants in securing placements across various organizations aligned with their skills and professional interests. The assistance encompassed job search facilitation and coordination with prospective employers, thereby enhancing the overall scope of employment prospects for trained individuals.

# Advance Garments production training



- During the period from May to March, a total of **120** beneficiaries participated in the Advanced Garments Production Training program. Out of these, **35** beneficiaries successfully transitioned into production, earning between ₹2000 and ₹2800 per month and collectively stitching over 7,500 units throughout the year. The program not only enhanced their technical skills but also provided essential linkages with government schemes to support beneficiaries with disabilities, facilitating access to wheelchairs and pensions.
- Over **100** new garment designs were developed to tap into the corporate gifting and domestic markets, thereby generating more business opportunities and improving earning potential. Participants received advanced training in layering, cutting, and pattern making, equipping them to meet the growing demands of both online and local markets. The introduction of Zoho systems helped them learn inventory and stock management through digital tracking.
- Exposure at the Impact Summit offered an invaluable platform for beneficiaries to interact with corporate clients, boosting their morale and confidence to grow further. As a result of the training, the participants gained practical skills in stitching various apparel types such as T-shirts, trousers, shorts, kurtis, hoodies, sweatshirts, crop tops, and tank tops. They also acquired knowledge of multiple printing techniques, including sublimation, DTF, screen, and panel printing, as well as bulk production processes. While the 35 beneficiaries have become self-sustained, continuous efforts are needed to enhance monthly income levels for long-term sustainability.

# LEARNABLED



LearnAbleD is an inclusive and fully accessible virtual training institute designed to empower Persons with Disabilities through in-demand, industry-ready technical and non-technical courses

## OBJECTIVE

Our goal is to build a skilled and job-ready workforce of Youth with Disabilities, equipped with the competencies and confidence to meet industry requirements.

These courses are designed for Persons with Disabilities, catering to both freshers and experienced professionals. They aim to enhance qualifications and skill sets, enabling participants to stay competitive in the job market. The programs are fully accessible for individuals with all types of disabilities, featuring Sign Language Interpreters and Screen Reader compatibility.

During the financial year 2024-2025, the project successfully upskilled 450+ participants through 20+ flagship courses like Data Structures, Financial Analysis, Drone Programming, Robotics, and Competitive Exam Preparation. These collective efforts have significantly strengthened participants' employability while advancing our mission of building a more inclusive and diverse workforce.



## Key Highlights

- **Crash Course on Data Structures and Algorithms (Java & Python):**  
14 students successfully completed the course. Currently, 6 participants are employed, while others are in the process of clearing interviews with various corporates.
- **Financial Analysis Course:**  
22 students completed the course, with 7 securing new jobs, 3 applying their newly acquired skills in existing roles, and 5 profiles shared with corporates for placement opportunities.
- **Financial Analysis Course (O2C):**  
23 students completed this specialized course launched in January, with 6 participants already employed.
- **Drone Programming Course:**  
22 students were shortlisted for this course, which focused on drone design, development, data processing, and GIS applications. The course, launched in January 2025, included an offline session in Pune, where participants engaged in hands-on drone building during a one-week residential program.
- **Competitive Exam Preparation:**  
25 candidates were selected for training in SSC, Railway, and Banking examinations. Sessions began in January 2025, and participants completed their assessments during the March offline session, where certificates were also awarded.
- An offline training session was conducted in Bangalore for six days, enabling candidates to interact directly with trainers and clarify their doubts. Certificates were distributed during the offline session in the presence of the Registrar and faculty members of JRDU, Chittrakoot.
- A **virtual job fair** was conducted between December 2024 and January 2025, with participation from empaneled corporates. Over 30 candidate profiles were shared, and interviews were conducted during the event. representatives.
- Profiles of eligible candidates were shared with leading companies such as Myntra, Amazon, Allstate, Syngenta, MNIIT, Data Pulse Global Services Pvt Ltd, Synchronic IT solutions, Infosys

# University/ HEI Accessibility Awareness Program and Website Accessibility Audit

The website accessibility audit has been conducted for the state of Kerala for 2 colleges. They being: - National Institute of Speech and Hearing (NISH - Kerala) and - Kuriakose Chavara Memorial ITI (Kerala). Now these websites are can be accessed by different types of disabilities including the candidates with vision impairment.




